

Stodghill Application Guidelines

To be eligible to apply for a Stodghill Research Professorship, you must be:

1. On the tenure-track (past mid-probationary review) or tenured.
2. Carrying a full-time teaching load (18 hrs).
3. No less than six years from your most recent Stodghill Research Professorship award.

Faculty members may not couple a Stodghill Research Professorship with sabbatical.

Proposal Due Date: **October 1st**

- **Proposals are limited to 1,500 words.**
- **Project description:** Describe the project in a manner comprehensible to the diverse members of the FDC, and include **how your project:**
 - Contributes to your area(s) of expertise (new knowledge it produces/value to your discipline(s) and/or students, e.g.).
 - Is situated within the norms of your area(s) of expertise so that someone outside your area can imagine its progress relative to the output and scholarly work typical of your field(s).
 - The impact of your research on other subdisciplines, fields or non-academic venues.
 - Supports your personal scholarship/career goals and trajectory.
- Indicate what concrete results you expect from the term's work and indicate if the aim is to finish a whole project or part of a larger project.
- Detail how you will use your time during the semester and describe how the project is feasible within the time frame requested.
 - Scope of the project with respect to time available.
 - Role of the project within larger context of your area of scholarship.
 - Disciplinary norms for feasibility.
 - Make note of any time-sensitive or special circumstances that necessitate your requested window of time for the two-course release associated with a Stodghill award.
- Explain how the release time will affect your program and **confirm that you have discussed these issues with your program and division chair.**

Please note that Stodghill awards are typically **not granted for starting new projects**, and preference may be given to projects for which the Stodghill release would allow completion of a project or of a portion of a project that would qualify as significant advancement towards finishing a full project. Therefore, please provide a separate list of:

- Progress already completed on this project.
- Specific tasks to be undertaken.
- Timeline of work to date and a clear plan for addressing specific tasks to be completed during the Stodghill.
