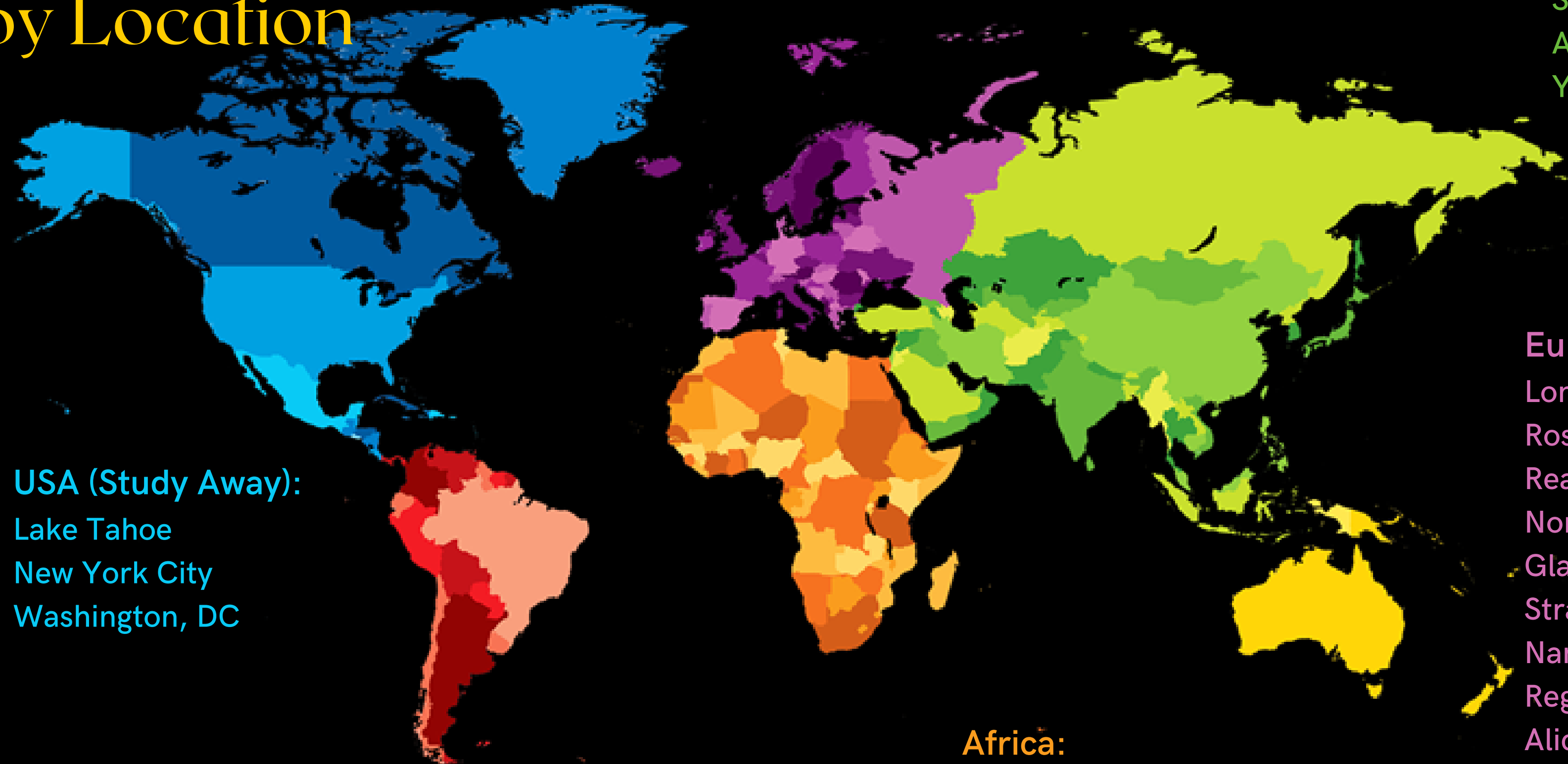

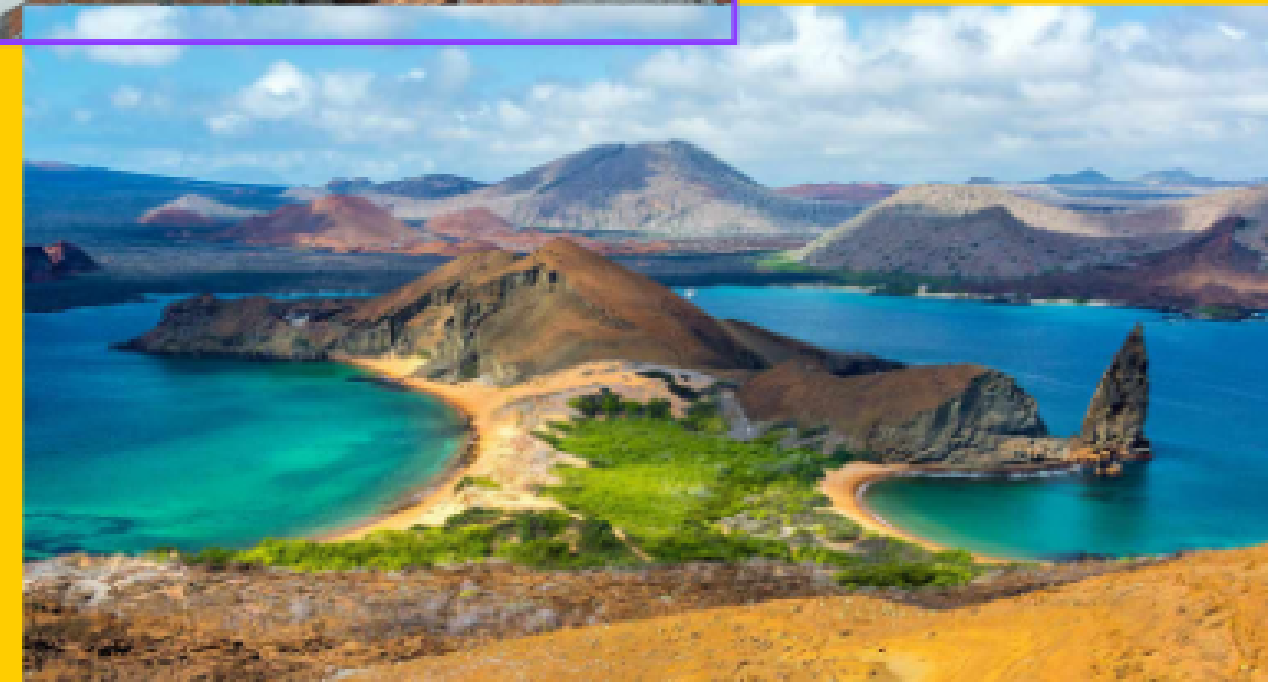

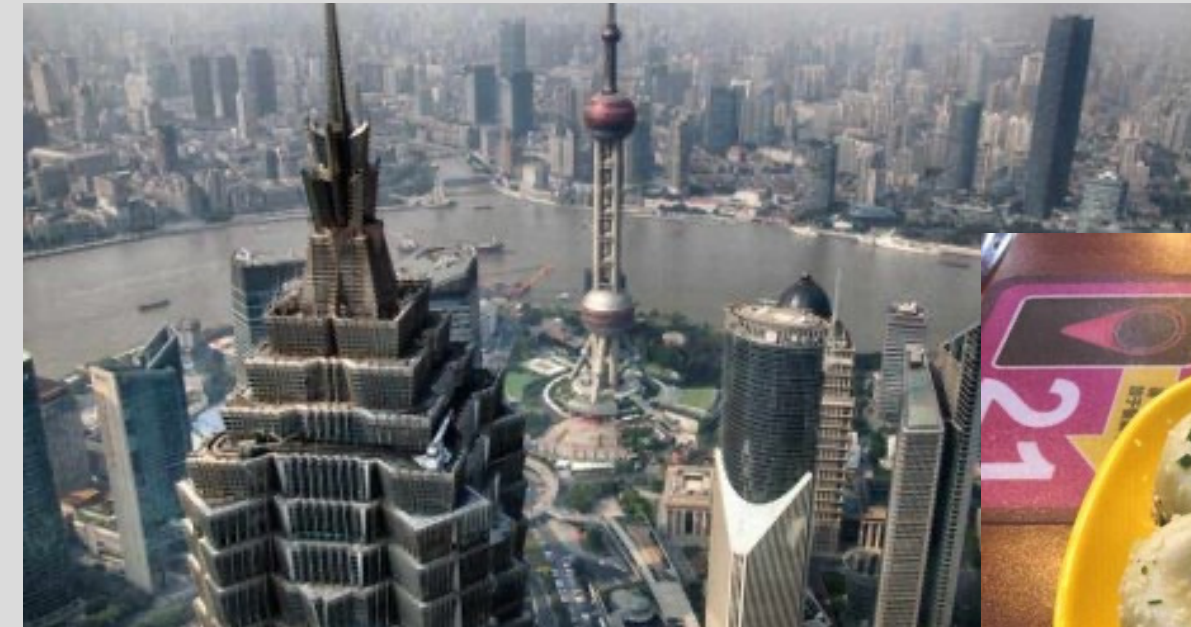

CENTRE-IN-SHANGHAI CHINA

All students take Chinese Society in the 21st Century (Sociology) and 6 credit hours of Mandarin. Students can then choose to complete an internship and/or an elective from the following list:

- POL 350: Contemporary Chinese Politics – State, Party, People
- ENS 385: The City and the Environment

CENTRE-IN-READING ENGLAND

Students should have a 3.0+ GPA

Great appeal for students who seek a more independent abroad experience.

Students select three or four courses totaling 25 ETCS hours (translating into either 12 or 13 Centre credit hours) from those available across many departments.

Reading is ranked internationally as:

- 12 for Agriculture (1 among UK institutions)
- 33 for Earth and Marine Sciences (7 in UK)
- 41 for Archaeology (8 in UK)
- 54 for Environmental Sciences (9 in UK)
- Top 150 for Accounting and Finance, Art & Design, Business & Management Studies, English Language & Literature, and Geography
- Top 200 for History, and Linguistics



CENTRE-IN-NANTES FRANCE

Centre has teamed up with Sewanee and IES with their Nantes-French Language Immersion & Area Studies Program.

Students will take classes at the Université de Nantes.

Students will be able to improve French language skills while studying and exploring all that the beautiful city of Nantes has to offer. Nantes is home to delicious food and rich culture, and it is a very easy city to navigate. This program also includes excursions to the coast, Paris, and other locations in France.
