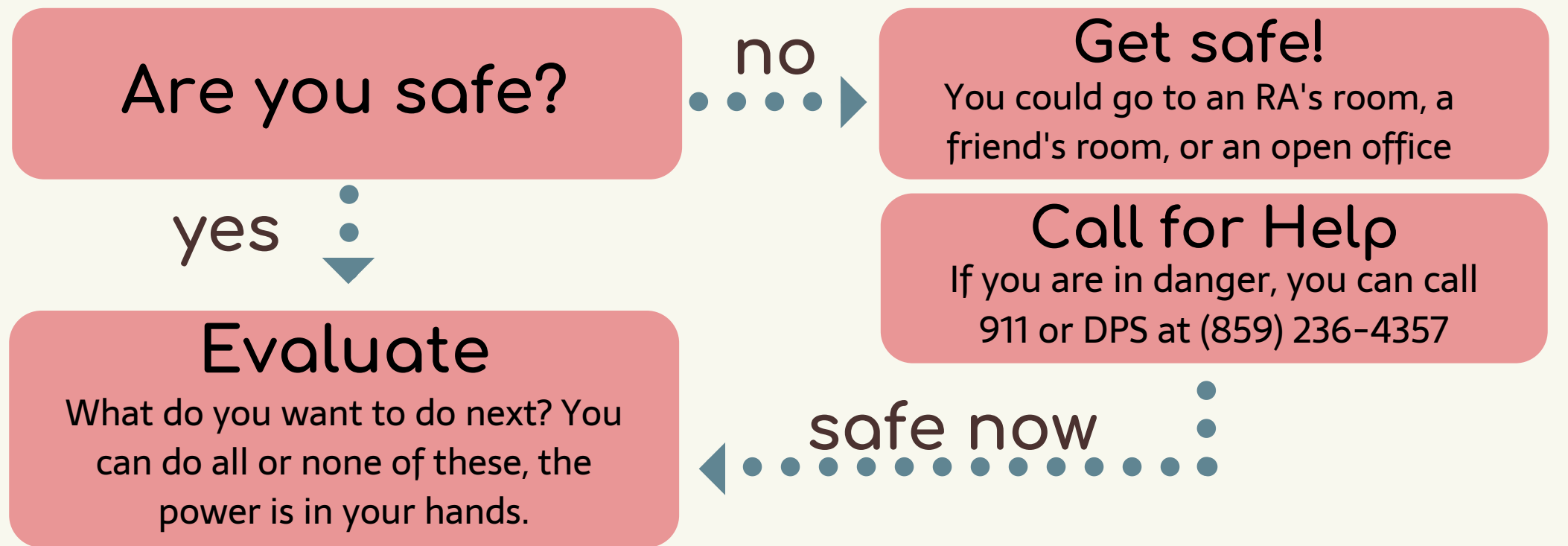


Your Options After Sexual Misconduct



Talk to Someone
Talking to someone you trust can help you figure out what you want to do.

Centre Counseling
Call (859) 238-5530 or email counseling@centre.edu and say it's urgent due to a crisis

Ampersand Resource Center Support Line
They offer support, referrals, and can meet you at the emergency room and/or accompany you to the police department

Call a friend or family member

Residence Life Staff
RAs and RDs have specialized training and can help you access resources that you might not know about or just be an empathetic listener. They must report information you share to the Title IX Coordinator.

Faculty, Staff, Coaches
If you have a trusted adult who works at Centre, you can talk to them, but they must report that information to the Title IX Coordinator. Some members of this group have training on this subject and some do not.

Seek Medical Attention
Ephraim McDowell's emergency room is the closest option. Someone from Ampersand can accompany you if you call 1 (800) 656-4673

SAFE Kit
You will be offered a Sexual Assault Forensic Exam that will preserve evidence within 96 hours of an incident. This will not automatically result in an investigation by Centre or the police. This can be free but you must make it clear that you do not want your insurance billed.

Prophylactic Medication
You will be offered medicines to prevent sexually transmitted infections (STIs) and/or pregnancy.

Centre Student Health
If you decide not to go to the emergency room, orders for STI testing, STI treatment, and emergency contraception are available at Student Health.

Consider Reporting
You can make a report if it feels right to you. Sometimes reporting can help you seek justice and begin the healing process, and can allow you to get accommodations to feel safe here at Centre.

Reporting to Police
Centre can provide an escort to the police station to file a report or get a restraining order

Reporting to Centre
You can make a report to the Title IX Office by calling 859-238-5467, emailing Kay Drake, or using the online form on Centrenet. You can report anonymously but this will make investigation difficult.

Decide if You Want an Investigation
You can decide if you want to participate in an informal or formal investigation. Accommodations may be limited if there is no investigation, but you may decide what is right for you.
