FACULTY/STAFF ADVISOR DESCRIPTION

Introduction

Theme House Communities nurture and enhance a student's connections with fellow students, faculty, and staff. They provide unique opportunities for students to create a tight community of residents who share common interests and experiences. Theme Houses are designed to deliver academic and social benefits that increase residential engagement, which has been shown to correlate with improved learning and retention among participants.

Time Commitment

The Theme House Advisor role commitment is 8-10 hours per month. The hours include but are not limited to building connections with residents, approving programming proposals and activities, facilitating monthly meetings with the Theme House residents, and maintaining the programming budget. The Centre College Residence Life Office recognizes that Advisors have other academic, personal, and professional time commitments as well. Much autonomy is granted for an advisor to fulfill the responsibilities below in ways that work best for the individual and the residents.

Responsibilities

- Attend theme-specific House Advisor Orientation
- Work to actualize the Theme Community mission through student interaction, programming and assessment
- Approve one theme-related program per month
- Take students to at least one community outreach event per year
- Track attendance at Theme events
- Assist in Theme marketing and recruitment for the following year

Eligibility

Preference will be given to individuals who have previously been part of the specific Theme or have connections to the topic area. However, any candidate interested in working as a Theme House Resident Advisor is encouraged to share their interest and their application will be considered.
